MEMORIAL HERMANN NORTHEAST VOLUNTEERS, HOUSTON, SOAR WITH THE LIFE FLIGHT TEAM!

The annual Humble Health Fair had always been supported by the Memorial Hermann Northeast Volunteers, but this year was something special! Because they merged with the Memorial Hermann System in January, they were able to get one of the Life Flight helicopters to land at the Humble Civic Center! They were also able to do some fundraising for the \$40 million drive Memorial Hermann Foundation was staging to replace and expand the existing 17 year old fleet. Life Flight receives no federal, state or local monies. The program is funded entirely by Memorial Hermann and its philanthropic partners.

The MHNE Volunteers passed out information sheets on Life Flight and told visitors interesting facts about the program. For instance, did they know the helicopters service an area 150 nautical miles from the Texas Medical Center including Austin, Victoria, Palestine and Lake Charles? And did they know one new, fully equipped helicopter costs approximately \$6 million dollars? Did they know that Life Flight transports patients regardless of their ability to pay and approximately 25% of the flights involve children?

Many of the people who attended the Health Fair and visited the Life Flight helicopter had previous first hand experience with the program. There is simply no way to estimate how many lives have been saved by Life Flight in the 110,000 missions they have flown since the program began in 1976.

GRAHAM REGIONAL MEDICAL CENTER held their annual Chalupa Luncheon, October 13th. Chalupas, cake and drinks were served to over 1000 people. Also included in the fundraiser were raffle items, bake sale items, cookbook sales and a gift shop on the gazebo offering Halloween, fall and Christmas items. The luncheon was held on the downtown square in beautiful fall weather. The fundraiser raised over \$17000 and the proceeds were given to Graham Regional Medical Center to buy needed equipment.

Atlanta Memorial Health Fair

Recently volunteers from the Atlanta Memorial Hospital were requested to participate in an unusual health fair. The health fair was the "brain child" of the Cass County Extension Agency and was geared toward men's health. The fair kicked off with a workshop for men only whereby health issues such as hypertension, stroke, prostate cancer, etc., were addressed. At the end of the workshop, the participants were encouraged to visit the site where information, blood pressure checks, glucose checks, etc., were available. Atlanta Memorial Hospital gave discounts on PSA tests and provided nursing personnel to do blood pressure and glucose checks. Volunteers provided information on the various health issues and encourage participants to take advantage of the free checks and literature. The workshop and health fair were well received by the community.
